Garden Maintenance


Merton Council has appointed a new company 'idverde' to maintain its parks and open spaces from 1 February. We attended a meeting with them and other Park Friends groups in January. The contract will require them to be responsible for both gardening and litter collection. A different company, whose contract starts in April, will deal with street cleaning.

Our park is a flagship park and a high standard of maintenance is required by the contract. **YOU** can all help us with the new contract because it is based on outcomes. If we do not think the grass is short enough or the beds planted in the way we are used to then we can ask for the issue to be addressed.

The kiosk has seating inside during the winter and it is a lovely place to enjoy a coffee and look out on the beautiful gardens while staying warm and comfortable!
